Bridging communities through language

In February 2024, the Romanian Speaking Club community initiative was launched, led by A.O. Help from the Republic of Moldova in partnership with the Inovatrium Association from Romania. Supported by UN Women Moldova and funded by the Women's Peace & Humanitarian Fund, this initiative aims to foster language skills and cultural exchange.

Coordinated by members of the "Today's Women Leaders, Tomorrow's Peace" project, the language club brings together participants from the Republic of Moldova and refugees from Ukraine. Through interactive board games and team activities, participants enhance their Romanian language skills while socializing and forming new connections. The club has been instrumental in helping Ukrainian refugees integrate into the local community, promoting cultural exchange and fostering solidarity and collaboration among women participants.

Learning in Refuge: Safeguarding Education for Ukraine's Displaced Children

Meet Yuliia and Sasha from Odessa, who sought safety in Moldova amid the ongoing conflict in Ukraine. They arrived in 2022, escaping the proximity of rocket attacks in their hometown. "We lived in a fivestory building, and it was shocking to realize there was nowhere to escape," Yuliia recalls. In Moldova, Yuliia found employment in the beauty industry, a field she greatly enjoys. Her five-year-old son, Sasha, quickly adapted to his new environment at the "Dyvosvit" Educational Center. There, he continued his school preparations and made friends with other refugee children in a familiar cultural setting. The "Dyvosvit" project, operated in 2024 by the National Congress of Ukrainians in Moldova at the Chisinau Taras Shevchenko Gymnasium, is supported by ChildFund and WeWorld. The initiative aims to provide refugee children in Moldova with education and foster a sense of community among refugees.

Empowering Roma Refugee Women in Moldova

In April 2024, AO UTR Tarna Rom co-organized the Roma Women's March, a key event during the "Amare Amala" Roma Culture Week. The event, orchestrated by the Roma Women's Platform ROMNI in collaboration with UN Women, aimed to spotlight the challenges faced by local and refugee Roma women. The march served as a powerful statement recognizing the contributions of Roma women to society while addressing the discrimination and stereotypes they continue to encounter. Participants included Roma women from the Republic of Moldova and Ukrainian refugees, showcasing the solidarity and diversity within the Roma community. The symbolic route started at Moldova Post in the city center, moved past the Presidency and the Monument to Stephen the Great, and concluded in front of the Government of the Republic of Moldova. The event underscored the ongoing need for sustained support in the pursuit of equality and fundamental rights for Roma people.

Community Support and Resilience in Bugeac

Caritas Moldova, with support from Norad and Caritas Norge, has launched a humanitarian initiative in the Găgăuz Autonomous Region, specifically targeting the community of Bugeac. This effort is part of a broader program aimed at improving living conditions for mothers with three or more children, individuals with disabilities, and residents facing poverty, including refugees from Ukraine.

During their visit, the Caritas Moldova team distributed food and pharmaceutical vouchers worth 250 lei, enabling community members to purchase essential nutrition and pharmaceuticals from partnered retail networks. The initiative also provided psychosocial support and encouragement to single mothers, persons with disabilities, and economically disadvantaged community members. This effort aims to address immediate needs, contribute to building community resilience, and foster a supportive environment.

Brick by Brick: Fostering cohesion Egorovca

In Egorovca, Fălești, a community-building event titled "In the World of LEGO" was hosted at the village library, engaging children from Egorovca and Ukrainian refugee children in LEGO building activities. Organized by the Public Association "Stoicii" and supported by APSCF through the project "Strengthening Cohesion between Ukrainian Refugees and Host Communities in the Republic of Moldova," funded by Caritas Austria, the event aimed to provide a playful yet educational environment for participants. According to a representative from AO Stoicii, these activities are designed to facilitate interaction among children, helping them build friendships and strengthen community ties. The children shared that the activity not only allowed them to enjoy building LEGO sets but also helped them form new friendships and enhance their community connections. This initiative highlights the importance of interactive and inclusive activities in fostering understanding and cooperation among children from diverse backgrounds, contributing to the social integration of refugee children within local communities.
